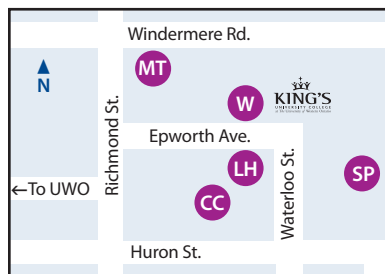

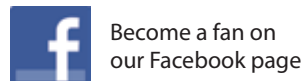

Sacramental & Liturgical Life

The celebration of the Church's liturgies are central to our life at King's. It is here that we strive to deepen our relationship with the Triune God and with one another. As a community of the baptized, it is around the Tables of God's Word and Sacrament that we seek strength for living the gospel with integrity.

Our community gathers in prayer daily to celebrate our life as God's beloved. We are accompanied on this journey with men and women from Windermere on The Mount, members of the community Sisters of St. Joseph of London and others from the city who have made Christ the King University Parish their home.

We celebrate Eucharist every Sunday at 10:30 am at 1486 Richmond Street on the southeast corner of Richmond Street and Windermere Road. When the students in are session, we have a second gathering at 5:00 pm at "Bessie" Labatt Hall.

All are welcome to join us in prayer and celebration.

Scripture Reflection

The Message is a group that meets weekly to discuss and reflect on scripture. Each week we reflect on the scripture that will be proclaimed at Sunday's Eucharist allowing us to celebrate and enter into church's liturgical cycle. The readings are placed within their scriptural context. Participants then pray and discern on how the readings speak to us today.

Spiritual Direction

Spiritual direction is about drawing closer to God. Young adults often lead hectic, busy lives – sometimes it can be difficult to notice the movement of the Spirit in day-to-day life. In spiritual direction, we are invited to slow down and reflect more deeply on our experiences – to recognize the grace and presence of the Lord in our lives. In fact, spiritual direction is not really about being "directed," in the sense of being "told what to do" – instead, a spiritual director is a listening, attentive companion on your spiritual journey ... someone to encourage you towards a deeper relationship with God.
